Review and approve federal grant funding from the Antiterrorism and Emergency Assistance Program (AEAP) administered through the Wisconsin Department of Justice in the amount of \$478,564.

Details:

The City of Waukesha was awarded a grant through the Antiterrorism and Emergency Assistance Program (AEAP). The grant is to support the provision of victim services related to the 2021 Christmas Parade attack in Waukesha, Wisconsin. The Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) supports victims of mass violence and terrorism through the Antiterrorism and Emergency Assistance Program (AEAP). Funding for this program comes from the Antiterrorism Emergency Reserve.

This financial support is for those who responded to, investigated, partook in, or assisted in the mitigation of the Christmas Parade tragedy on November 21st, 2021. These four projects are to focus on the wellness and resiliency of those first responders that were impacted by this mass casualty event.

- 1. First Responder Mental Health and Building on Wellness and Resiliency
- 2. Wellness and Resiliency liaison
- 3. First Responder based community training.
- 4. Families of First Responder anti-fragility training

Options & Alternatives:

Accept the grant funding as presented or reject the funding and terminate wellness and resiliency services noted above.

Financial Remarks:

All expenses related to these activities are expected to be covered by this grant program.
