TRANSIT:

- VACANCIES: 2 (Security Guard PT (2))
- WisGo cards and the app are being accepted on Metrolift. Passengers can continue to buy two
 ride tickets for Metrolift until the end of the year and will have until April 30, 2025 to use up the
 two ride tickets. Transit is working with Metrolift passengers to have them get their new WisGo
 ID cards as they will have multiple more convenient options to reload value to their cards
 including on line at umopass.com vs. having to come to the Transit Center to purchase the two
 ride cards.
- 2024 CIP projects Update-
 - Badger Drive Remodel- Rough plumbing is complete. The network cabinet is scheduled to be moved by mid-October. New studs are being installed.
 - The Badger Drive Fence has been installed and the electronic components for access is scheduled to be completed by the end of the month.

- o The AC condenser unit replacement at the Transit Center will be installed in October.
- A Public Hearing for Proposed changes to the fares will be held at the October 17th Transit Commission meeting. The changes were proposed in the Financial Management Plan and will be considered at the October 17th meeting.
- Staff continues to work on service changes proposed in the Financial Management Plan that would be implemented in mid-2025.
