7. Matter of Report

A. ID#23-7700 Drop Off Center Food Waste Composting Pilot Program.

Sponsors: Public Works

Dustin Nolan, Solid Waste and Recycling Manager, reported on the Compost Crusaders company of St. Francis and the intent to run a pilot program for October and November at the Drop Off Center. This would be an opportunity for residents to bring food waste for composting. Running a pilot program such as this would be a good opportunity to gage the residents interest as the trend right now is sustainability. Mr. Nolan also stated that in the spring of 2025 the garbage contract expires and he wants to see if composting could reduce the City's waste cost. There would be no charge for residents to compost at the Drop Off Center. If it ends up being a huge operation, there may be a charge down the road. Ald. Payne inquired as to who would benefit from the actual composted material? Mr. Nolan responded it would be hauled off site to a farm to compost and they could sell the product. Vice Chair Kevin Reilly stated, as a composter, loves the idea of diverting good compost out of the trash stream and sending it back to the environment. He inquired as to how often would they be picked up as the raccoons in Waukesha know how to open lids. Also, the need to address the problem of loading and hauling. Ideally it would make sense to have community composting sites to bring it to. We're taking away the benefit by using gas to haul to it away to a farm in St. Francis. Parks, Recreation & Forestry Department needs to be involved as they have little parks all over for composting and then let it be free for the neighborhood, as well as include restaurants. Ald. Pieper asked where at the Drop Off Center would these bins go as he is concerned of the smell and animals. He doesn't want the city to mandate composting. He prefers it to stay voluntary. Lastly Mr. Nolan added that the paper shredding day is September 23rd.
