Re: 2023 Significant Revisions to City Codes 13.055 and 13.056

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- 1) Added definitions: 1) Bulky Items, 2) Residential Solid Waste and Recycling Regulations, and 3) Container.
 - 2) Consolidated “regulations” to a singular Recycling and Solid Waste Regulations document.
 - 3) Clarified differences between service types – automated services and manual services.
 - 4) Consolidated formerly separate garbage and recycling eligibility provisions to a singular General Eligibility provision.
 - 5) Revised required set out time (of carts, containers, and bulky item) from no later than 6:30 A.M. to 6 A.M. on day of collections.
 - 6) Clarified eligibility limiting allowance of multi-family properties to a maximum of 8 dwelling units per shared driveway access.
 - 7) Clarified cart placement instructions requiring carts must be easily accessible to the collection vehicle and in a position free from overhead hazards. And the carts must be placed within the property line limits and adjacent to the property line boundary.
 - 8) Clarified that non-automated pickup properties may not leave their containers at the edge of the property (the alley) on non-service days.
 - 9) Clarified that non-automated service properties are limited to the equivalent of 96-gallons volume of solid waste or recyclables set-out (per week).
 - 10) Cross referenced to city codes 17.04 (3)(b) and 12.03(5) regarding appropriate non-automated containers for service at non-automated properties.
 - 11) Clarified recycling schedule is determined by the city per the terms of contract with the hauler.
 - 12) Regarding 13.056 – added clarifying provision requiring proper disposal for non-residential properties at their expense.
