4. Discussion and Recommendation re:
 - A. [ID#21-3039](#) Please consider and act on installing a "No Trucks Over 3 Ton" on Jefferson Avenue from E. Moreland Blvd. to Gale Street.
Recommendation: This item was brought forward by Ald. Rodriguez. Residents on Jefferson Avenue have concerns about an increase in truck traffic on their street. The truck traffic is mainly for the distribution center on Gale Street. The Department of Public Works does not have any issues with placing a weight restriction signing on Jefferson Avenue. The cost for installing the weight restriction signs would be around \$200 and covered by the 2021 Building and Grounds Sign Budget (3310.54140).

- B.** [ID#21-3040](#) Please consider and act on removing the US Foods sign on Moreland Blvd. at White Rock Avenue and replace that sign with one indicating Burris Logistics.
- Recommendation:** This item was brought forward by Ald. Rodriguez. In 2019, the Building and Grounds Committee approved the installation of a sign at the intersection of E. Moreland Blvd. and White Rock Avenue. The sign was to direct truck drivers to use White Rock Avenue to access then US Foods Corp. This distribution center has changed ownership and is now Burris Logistics. The sign is now requested to be changed out to say "To Burris Logistics". The Department of Public Works does not have any issue changing out this sign. However, the cost for the sign should be paid for by Burris Logistics. The Committee can decide if they want Burris to pay for the replacement sign.
- The cost for installing a new sign would be around \$200 and covered by the 2021 Building and Grounds Sign Budget (3310.54140). Or, the Committee can make it a requirement of approval to have Burris Logistics to pay the city to make and install the sign.

- C.** [ID#21-3041](#) Please consider a 3 ton weight restriction on River Valley Road from C.T.H. H River Road to 600 feet south of State Trunk Hwy 59 Les Paul Pkwy.
- Recommendation:** This item was brought forward by Ald. McElderry. Residents in the River Valley Road neighborhood have concerns about an increase in truck traffic on River Valley Road when the proposed Kwik Trip is opened and the traffic signal at Les Paul Pkwy. is operational. The request is to prohibit trucks over 3 Ton from using River Valley Road from CTH H (River Road) to the Kwik Trip development but not prohibit Kwik Trip from making fuel and grocery deliveries. To accommodate this, the 3 Ton limit signs would be placed at River Road and at a distance of 600 feet south of Les Paul Pkwy. The Department of Public Works does not have any issues with placing a weight restriction signing on River Valley Road.
- The cost for installing the weight restriction signs would be around \$200 and covered by the 2021 Building and Grounds Sign Budget (3310.54140).

- Recommendation:** This item was brought forward by Ald. Bartels. Residents in the Rolling Ridge neighborhood want a sign installed on Willard Lane at Lancaster Drive. Said intersection is currently uncontrolled. The Department of Public Works has no issues with installing a stop sign at this location.
- The cost for installing the Stop Sign would be around \$100 and covered by the 2021 Building and Grounds Sign Budget (3310.54140).
