Approval and authorization of contract between City of Waukesha and Jani-King of Milwaukee for Custodial Services at the Schuetze Recreation Center.

Details:

Waukesha Parks, Recreation & Forestry Department (WPRF) is contracting with Jani-King of Milwaukee to provide custodial services for the Schuetze Recreation Center. This is a re-bid of the previous custodial contract. The Contract includes all labor, supervision, and cleaning materials to provide cleaning services seven days a week during third shift hours of all rooms including floors, windows, restrooms, garbage removal, dusting, sanitizing, etc. The City Attorney and Jani-King staff have reviewed and approved this contract.

Options & Alternatives:

WPRF staff considers contracting with Jani-King of Milwaukee to be the most efficient and cost effective method to maintain cleanliness of the Schuetze Recreation Center during the off hours, due to their expertise and experience.

Financial Remarks:

The contract amount is \$35,400, which is up slightly as this has not been bid in several years, and we are increasing the frequency from five days a week to seven days a week. This is budgeted for with \$32,000 coming from the Recreation other professional services (5310.52190) and \$3,400 from the Recreation building maintenance (5310.52470).

Executive Action:

Recommend approval of the contract between City of Waukesha and Jani-King and authorize the Mayor to enter into this contract.
