RE: Main Street (GLCD0005) Water Main Replacement Project

The bids for the Main Street, Clinton to Barstow Utility and Street Improvement project will be opened by the City at 11am on Friday, January 15, 2016.

I will prepare an updated memo with the results and revised suggested motion when the bid tab is available from City Engineering. The updated memo will be emailed to the Commissioners, uploaded to Granicus and available at the meeting. The Board of Public Works should take action at their January 21<sup>st</sup> meeting; with action by the Common Council scheduled to occur at their February 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting.

The project is one of the Distribution System Projects (DSI) for 2016. We are replacing the existing 12-inch and 10-inch diameter mains installed in 1909 with a 24-inch main. This project is a continuation of the last two Downtown projects and is listed as Segment AC in our Master Planning documents.

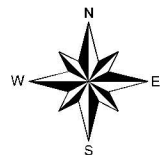
At the December 2015 meeting, the Commission approved the project including our labor, construction costs, and the 1% city administration fee for a total not to exceed \$792,600 using the monies budgeted in account #3431.
