Subject: Update parking zone on Grand Avenue between College Avenue and the railroad tracks from 1 hour to 3 hours.	

Details:
 2/5/2024. This item was brought forward by Ald. Halvensleben to update the parking restriction on the west side of Grand Avenue between the railroad tracks to College Avenue from 1 hour to 3 hours. This is to aid the adjacent businesses for any of their customers needing more than the 1-hour time frame. Engineering staff have reviewed this request and do not have an issue with updating the parking restriction from 1 hour to 3 hours.

3/4/2024. This item was brought forward by Ald. Halvensleben to update the parking restriction on the west side of Grand Avenue between the railroad tracks to College Avenue from 1 hour to 3 hours. From the previous Building & Grounds meeting, it was determined to hold this item to further evaluate the parking situation between on the on-street parking and the parking lots around the business. All of the employees park in the back of the buildings and the front parking regularly fills up. The 1 hour parking is usually too short of a duration for most patrons. Instead of the initial 3 hour request, 2 hour parking is being requested as that should still provide enough time for patrons plus it fits in with the 2-hour parking to the north on Grand Avenue from the railroad tracks to Wisconsin Avenue. Engineering staff have reviewed this request and do not have an issue with updating the parking restriction from 1 hour to 2 hours.

Options & Alternatives:
 None

Financial Remarks:
 The cost for installing three (3) parking signs would be around \$140 and covered by the 2024 Building and Grounds Sign Budget (3310.54140).

Executive Recommendation:
 The Department of Public Works recommends establishing 2-hour parking on the west side of North Grand Avenue from 170' south of the railroad tracks to 315' north of West College Avenue.
