<b>Subject:</b> Resolutions setting salaries of Mayor, Municipal Judge, and City Attorney for terms beginning 2018.	

#### Details:

Wisconsin Statutes §62.09(6) requires that salaries for elective city offices be established "before the earliest time for filing nomination papers for the office." The terms of the offices of Mayor, Municipal Judge and City Attorney are expiring in 2018, and the earliest time for filing nomination papers for those offices is December 1. Therefore, it's time to establish the salaries for those positions for the next term.

The draft resolutions accompanying this cover sheet provide for a 2% increase for each position, and a 2% increase for each successive year. This is less than the 2.5% increase generally being received by most City employees for 2018.

The Mayor, Municipal Judge, and City Attorney have received no pay increases over the last four years.

#### Options & Alternatives:

If no action is taken, then salaries remain at the previous levels.

#### Financial Remarks:

Financial impact is as shown in the resolutions. The salary figures for 2018 have already been included in the 2018 budget, and have been approved by the Finance Committee.

#### Staff Recommendation:
