SIDEWALK REPAIR POLICY

FOR

CITY OF WAUKESHA

- 1) The City shall complete an annual Sidewalk Maintenance project which focuses on one specific area of the City to replace existing sidewalk meeting the criteria of Section 3 below. This annual project will replace as much sidewalk as feasible based on the allocated CIP budget for said project. In general, the area of focus shall be adjacent to the previous years' stopping point, working in a clockwise direction around the City.
- 2) The City shall also complete sidewalk maintenance work in coordination with other CIP projects. Sidewalk within these project limits shall be inspected using the criteria outlined in Section 3 and replaced according to Municipal Code 6.115.
- 3) Sidewalks must be repaired if any of the following conditions exist:
 - a. A differential in elevation between any two adjoining pieces of sidewalk of more than one (1) inch.
 - b. A cracked sidewalk if pieces are missing.
 - c. A settled or damaged sidewalk that crosses a driveway where a paved drive approach has been ordered by the property owner.
 - d. A settled sidewalk of more than two (2) inches. The depth of settlement will be determined by measuring from a line set parallel to street on adjacent unsettled walk to the lowest point of settled walk.
- 2) Any sidewalk can be repaired or replaced if requested by the property owner.
- 4) All sidewalks brought to the attention of the City through complaints shall be repaired if they meet the criteria established in Section 4 3 of above.
- 5) The cost responsibility for the construction and replacement of sidewalk shall be in accordance with Municipal Code 6.115.

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
