Review and possible action to declare 223 S. West Ave. surplus property.

Issue Before the Board/Council:

The Water Utility is starting to decommission some of their facilities, as they will no longer be needed now that Waukesha contracts with Milwaukee for water service. 223 S. West is the first property they are ready to dispose of. There has been no other City use found for the property.

Options & Alternatives:

- 1. Declare the property surplus and direct the staff to complete a sale of the property.
- 2. Retain and maintain the property.

Additional Details:

223 S. West Ave. is a small building and parcel that has been used by the Water Utility for many years. The building is over 80 years old. Originally it was a well and reservoir site. In the 1970s it was converted to storage. The building is approximately 1,270 square feet and built adjacent to the railroad. The building also encroaches into the right-of-way about 6.5 feet. The building sits on a lot that is triangular in shape and is approximately 4,960 square feet. If the building was removed the lot would not be buildable due to its very small size and geometry. There are no restrooms in the building, no windows and the roof is 16 years old.

The Water Utility will be bringing additional properties forward to be declared surplus as the facilities are decommissioned. It is expected that at least 2 of the properties will be reused for City purposes.
