PAINT AND REPAIR GRANT SUMMARY:

- Paint and Repair Grants are funded by the Federal Government's Community Development Block Grant Program. Waukesha County administers the CDBG programs in our area. The City of Waukesha and the Landmarks Commission are a subgrantee.
- **Eligibility** – owners of residential properties in locally designated Historic Districts or individual Local Landmarks are eligible for Paint and Repair Grants.
 - Only properties in Federally designated low/moderate income census tracts are eligible. This includes most historic properties in Waukesha but excludes the Caples Park Historic District and part of the East Broadway Historic District.
- **Award timeline:** Grants are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis until the total annual allotment is used up. Work should generally be complete before the end of the year in which the grant is awarded.
- **Grant amount:** Typically 15% of the cost of a project, to a maximum of \$3,000.00. The Landmarks Commission has discretion to award different amounts based on overall impact, fund availability, or other circumstances.
- **Grant process:** grant approved by Landmarks Commission => work completed => applicant pays contractor in full => proof of payment to City => City issues grant to applicant.
