## Subject:

Review and act on a resolution terminating Tax Incremental Finance District Number 21

**Details**: Tax Incremental Finance (TID) Number 21 was created on November 9, 2012 as a Rehabilitation-Conservation District. The district was created to facilitate the redevelopment of the 33-acre former Spancrete facility. The property is now home to Woodman's grocery store and gas station, Culver's, a mixed-use retail building, Waukesha State Bank, and Planet Fitness.

As of the 2021 tax roll (payable in 2022), sufficient increment was collected to meet all the project costs and financial obligations of TID 21, so the district can be terminated. Upon termination the City will hire an independent auditor and any excess increment collected will be proportionally distributed to the overlying taxing jurisdictions.

This district had a base value of \$11,343,900 when created and now has an assessed value of \$42,537,800, an increase in value of \$33,944,600.

## **Options & Alternatives:**

**Financial Remarks:** Once the district closes the City of Waukesha and all the other taxing jurisdictions will see increased tax revenues based on the increased assessed value of the property.

## Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Common Council approve the proposed resolution terminating Tax Incremental District Number 21.
