Subject:

Review the traffic on South Washington Avenue and Lindbergh Avenue.

Details:

10/29/2024. This item was brought forward by Ald. Cory Payne as a referral to review the traffic and operation at the intersection of South Washington Avenue and Lindbergh Avenue. The referral came in from the perspective of how to better increase the line-of-sight of vehicles interacting through the intersection. Engineering staff will present their findings along with a possible alternative.

Options & Alternatives:

- 1. No change to the intersection control.
- 2. Update the intersection control to a traffic circle.

Financial Remarks:

To update the intersection control to a traffic circle, the items and cost for updating the signing include installing three (3) yield signs, three (3) roundabout circulation plaques, three (3) circular intersection warning signs, and four (4) sign poles which would be around \$825. To update the pavement marking, the cost to install required pavement marking would be around \$3,500. The total cost for signing and pavement marking to update the intersection control to a traffic circle would be around \$4,325 and covered by the 2024 Building and Grounds Special Projects Budget (3310.54141).

Executive Recommendation:

The Department of Public Works recommends no change to the intersection control. An alternative to update the intersection control to a traffic circle will be presented to the committee for discussion.
