B. Building & Grounds Committee - Ald. E. Payne

A. <u>ID#14-1012</u> Please consider placing a sign that says "Slow Down Autistic Child" in the 300 block of Baird Street.

Engineering staff has reviewed this item to install "Slow Down Autistic Child" on Bair Street in the 300 block. Our research has concluded that a sign that says "Slow Down Autistic Child" is not recommended to be installed and is not indorsed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). Generally, best practices in signing around the country recommend against installing signage of this sort since there is no correlation between their placement and drivers being more alert or slowing down. In follow up from the last Buildings & Grounds meeting, staff has received information from the resident making this request relative to other locations around country that have this type of signing. The information was reviewed briefly but not researched in depth. Staff recommends no action on this item.

B. ID#14-1367 Rescind all existing No Parking Zones on the north and south sides of Tosa Trail from Les Paul Pkwy to Paramount Drive

Engineering staff has reviewed several safety issues related to parking on Tosa Trail and on Paramount Drive. This item recommends to rescind all No Parking zones (to clear them) and establish a new No Parking zone that covers both the north side and south sides of Tosa Trail from Les Paul Parkway to Paramount Drive. Approving new parking restrictions will take place under item 3D.

Recommended Motion: Move to rescind all existing No Parking Zones on the north and south sides of Tosa Trail from Les Paul Pkwy to Paramount Drive.

C. ID#14-1372 Rescind existing No Parking Zone 7 a.m. to Noon on the east side of Pleasant Street from E. Broadway to 70 feet south of Arcadian Avenue.

Engineering staff has been in contact with the director of Volunteers of America on Pleasant Street to discuss the possibility of removing parking restrictions on the east side of Pleasant Street. Back in January 2014, the committee approved the installation of a Loading Zone area on the east side of Pleasant Street from Arcadian to 70 feet south in front of Volunteers of America building. At the same meeting, it was also recommended to rescind the existing the existing No Parking 7 am to noon restriction on the east side of Pleasant Street. The committee elected not to rescind the restriction. Engineering has reviewed this request again and recommends removal of this existing 7 am to noon parking restriction. The existing restriction was approved in 1995.

Recommended Motion: Move to rescind existing No Parking Zone 7 a.m. to Noon on the east side of Pleasant Street from E. Broadway to 70 feet south of Arcadian Avenue.

D. <u>ID#14-1370</u> Establish No Parking Anytime on the east side of Paramount Drive from the centerline of Tosa Trail to 250 feet north.

Engineering staff has reviewed several safety issues related to parking on Tosa Trail and on Paramount Drive. This item recommends establishing a No Parking zone on the east side of Paramount Drive around the sharp curve in order to improve driver safety.

Recommended Motion: Move to establish No Parking Anytime on the east side of Paramount Drive from the centerline of Tosa Trail to 250 feet north.

E. <u>ID#14-1369</u> Establish No Parking Anytime on the west side of Paramount Drive from 100 feet south to 260 feet north of Tosa Trail's centerline.

Engineering staff has reviewed several safety issues related to parking on Tosa Trail and on Paramount Drive. This item recommends establishing a No Parking zone on the west side of Paramount Drive around the sharp curve in order to improve driver safety.

Recommended Motion: Move to establish No Parking Anytime on the west side of Paramount Drive from 100 feet south to 260 feet north of the centerline of Tosa Trail.

F. <u>ID#14-1368</u> Establish No Parking Anytime on the north and south sides of Tosa Trail from Les Paul Pkwy to Paramount Drive

Engineering staff has reviewed several safety issues related to parking on Tosa Trail and on Paramount Drive. This item recommends to establish a new No Parking zone that covers both the north side and south sides of Tosa Trail from Les Paul Parkway to Paramount Drive.

Recommended Motion: Move to establish No Parking Anytime on the north and south sides of Tosa Trail from Les Paul Pkwy to Paramount Drive.

G. ID#14-1266 Please place No Parking on the south side of Dopp St. 70 feet east and 70 feet west of the corner of Dopp and Greenwood.

At the last B & G meeting, staff recommended to place No Parking signs on Dopp Street east and west of Greenwood rather than placing an All-Way Stop at this intersection.

Recommended motion: Move to establish No Parking Any Time on the south side of Dopp Street from 70 feet west to 70 feet east of the corners of the Dopp Street and Greenwood Avenue intersection.

Staff recommends approval of this item.

Engineering staff has researched a parking solution for Chicago Avenue in coordination with residents and the nearby Blair Elementary School. Currently the street has temporary No Parking signs.

Recommended motion: Move to establish No Parking Any Time on south side of Chicago Avenue from 30 feet west to 30 feet east of the corners of the Hyde Park Avenue and Chicago Avenue intersection.

Staff recommends approval of this installation.
