Resolution Supporting Wisconsin Department of Transportation's Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant Sidewalk Extension Project

Whereas the City of Waukesha wishes to obtain a cost-share grant from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, referred to herein as WisDOT, to fund sidewalk extensions along four City parcels through the Transportation Alternatives Program, referred to herein as the TAP.

Whereas the City recognizes that current missing pieces of sidewalk create a physical barrier in which pedestrians cannot safely continue walking to a destination or for recreation;

Whereas the WisDOT requires that applicants' governing bodies specifically support the project and require compliance with WisDOT rules and regulations in connection with such grants;

Whereas the WisDOT requires that applicants' governing body has the authority to make financial commitment;

Whereas the City recognizes that the WisDOT reimburses project sponsors for the federal share of the 80% of the approved TAP project costs, up to the limit of the federal award amount;

Whereas the City of Waukesha recognizes the minimum 20% match requirement, and has secured matching funds and/or commits to securing the matching funds;

Now, therefore, the Common Council of the City of Waukesha resolve as follows:

The Director of the City of Waukesha Department of Public Work is authorized and directed:

- To complete, sign, and submit the grant application on behalf of the City;
- To execute a grant agreement between the City and the WisDOT;
- To submit interim and final reports to the WisDOT to satisfy the grant agreement;
- To submit grant reimbursement requests to the WisDOT;
- To sign and submit other documentation required by the WisDOT;
