WAUKESHA METRO TRANSIT

Fixed Route Rates of Fare Effective 1/6/2020

Cash Fares

Adult \$2.00 Age 18 and over.

Youth \$1.25 Age 5 through 18 and with a valid identification of enrollment in an elementary or secondary school. This rate is not valid for students age 18 and over that are enrolled in a college, university, or technical school.

Senior \$1.00 Age 65 and over and only with identification: Medicare card or Metro Transit Reduced Fare Picture Identification Card.

Disabled \$1.00 Valid only with Medicare card or Metro Transit Reduced Fare Picture Identification Card. A Personal Care Attendant (PCA) accompanying a disabled rider may ride for no additional charge provided the disabled passenger certification requires them to ride with a PCA.

All cash fares must be deposited in the farebox by the passenger. Bus operators do not handle fares or provide change.

Fare Cards and Passes

All fare cards and passes must be used on the farebox each time the passenger boards a bus.

Day Pass \$5.00 Valid for unlimited rides the entire day when purchased. Expires at midnight.

10 Ride Card Adult \$18.00, Youth \$12.00, Senior/Disabled \$10.00 Valid for 10 rides up to 90 minutes each. Includes transfers. Does not expire. Identification must be shown as described under cash fares.

31 Day Pass \$50.00 Adult Valid for unlimited rides from the first day of use for 31 consecutive days.

31 Day Pass \$32.00 Youth Valid for unlimited rides from the first day of use for 31 consecutive days. Identification must be shown as described under cash fares.

31 Day Pass \$37.00 Senior/Disabled Valid for unlimited rides from the first day of use for 31 consecutive days. Identification must be shown as described under cash fares.

Summer Youth Pass \$40.00 Valid for the months of June, July, and August for unlimited riding by persons eligible to ride at the youth fares described above.

Fare cards are not transferable and are subject to confiscation if used illegally. Fare cards must remain in the possession of the rider while on the bus and must be shown at anytime upon request by the bus operator.

Group Passes Groups may obtain an advance group pass by contacting Waukesha Metro Transit. The group pass must be prepaid and indicate the desired routes to be taken for one way or round trip travel. Fares will be computed on the actual group makeup.

Training Passes Issued only at the discretion of Waukesha Metro Transit to persons assisting disabled persons and other passengers who may have difficulty riding the bus to learn how to ride the bus. Subject to time limitations listed on the pass.

FREE RIDES

The following passengers may ride free:

Waukesha Transit Commission employees (with picture employee identification).

Professional Transit Management of Waukesha, Inc. employees (with picture employee identification)

City of Waukesha, Town of Brookfield, City of Brookfield police in uniform.

Waukesha County Sheriff in uniform.

Children age 4 and under when accompanied by a fare paying guardian age 12 or over. A maximum of three children per guardian may ride free. Additional children will be charged a fare of \$1.25/passenger.

ELIGIBILITY FOR REDUCED FARES

Senior A passenger shall be eligible to ride at "senior" fares if the passenger is age 65 or older. Persons in the age group of 65 or over that are not eligible for a Medicare card may obtain a Metro Transit Reduced Fare Picture Identification Card upon presentation of proof of age, such as a valid driver's license or birth certificate.

Disabled A passenger shall be eligible to ride at "disabled" fares if the individual, by reason of illness, injury, age, congenital malfunction, or other permanent or temporary incapacity or disability, is unable without special planning or design to utilize mass transportation facilities and services as effectively as persons who are not so affected. A certification form indicating that an individual is disabled must be completed and approved to receive a Metro Transit Reduced Fare Picture Identification Card.

Medicare Card Holders A passenger shall be eligible to ride for the Senior/Disabled Fare upon presenting a valid Medicare card when boarding. Passengers possessing a valid Medicare card may receive a Metro Transit Reduced Fare Picture Identification Card upon presentation of the valid Medicare card at the Transit Center office.

TRANSFER POLICY

Between Waukesha Metro Transit Routes: Transfer cards are issued free upon request at the time a cash or fare is used to board a Waukesha Metro Transit bus. Transfers are valid at any bus stop on any route for a period of 90 minutes.

Between Waukesha Metro Transit and Wisconsin Coach Lines: Passengers boarding Waukesha Metro Transit buses with a valid Wisconsin Coach Lines Interline Transfer will ride free. Waukesha Metro Transit transfers will be issued to passengers boarding with a Wisconsin Coach Lines transfer upon payment of an appropriate fare.

Waukesha Metro Transit will issue an Interline Transfer (valid for travel on Wisconsin Coach Lines) to passengers boarding with a cash fare. Waukesha Metro Transit interline transfers will not be issued to boarding passengers at the downtown terminal stop. If the passenger receives an Interline Transfer, they may not receive a Metro transfer. If the passenger boards with a Metro transfer, the passenger may not receive an Interline transfer.

Between Waukesha Metro Transit and Milwaukee County Transit System: Passengers boarding Waukesha Metro Transit Route 1 with a valid MCTS M Card with valid transfer or valid MCTS Pass (1, 3, 7 or 31 Day, UPASS, Reduced, Go, Commuter Value) may ride Waukesha Metro Route 1 for free when boarding at stops common to MCTS and Waukesha Metro Transit at Brookfield Square Mall, and along Brookfield Square Dr. and Executive Dr. Transfer from Waukesha Metro Transit may be purchased at these bus stops when boarding with valid MCTS fare for an additional 50 cents.

Waukesha Metro Transit fare cards and transfers are valid for transportation on MCTS buses at the above listed stops at no additional charge.

Transfers between Waukesha Metro Transit and MCTS is only available at Brookfield Square Mall, and along Brookfield Square Dr. and Executive Dr.

Waukesha Metrolift Rates of Fare Effective January 6, 2020

Cash Fare \$4.00 All rides.

Fare Cards A 2 ride card is sold for \$8.00. Does not expire.

Agency Fare: Agencies are defined as an organization that serves persons that qualify for human service or transportation-related programs or services due to disability, income, or advanced age consistent with the President's Executive Order on Human Service Transportation Coordination (February 24, 2004). The fare will be the latest audited cost of a Metrolift ride, as shown in the Transit Financial and Statistical Report. Sold as a 2 ride card.

Individuals accompanying an ADA-eligible person will be charged the same fare. A personal care attendant included in the certification process may ride free when accompanying an ADA-eligible paratransit passenger (limit one personal care attendant per ADA-eligible rider).

At least one passenger in group must be certified as ADA paratransit eligible.

A Metrolift identification card must be shown at time the fare is paid.

Metrolift paratransit service will be provided for out-of-town visitors with disabilities for 21 days (not consecutive) from the date of their first trip on Waukesha Metrolift. Visitors must present a valid ADA paratransit eligible identification card from another transit system. If rides extend beyond 21 non-consecutive days, visitors must apply for local eligibility.
