<b>Subject:</b> Please update the crosswalk on the south crossing of Clinton Street and South Street to the "London Standard" style contingent on an agreement with the City and the owner of "Let It Be" regarding installation and maintenance costs.	

<b>Details:</b> 5/6/2024. This item was brought forward by Ald. Halvensleben to update crosswalk marking that crosses the south leg of Clinton Street at South Street to the "London Standard" (i.e. Zebra Crossing). The request came from the owner of "Let It Be" to have a pedestrian crossing similar to the Beatles album cover Abbey Road. That pedestrian crossing is the closest to "Let It Be" not including the pedestrian crossings at the signalized intersection at Clinton Street and Wisconsin Avenue.  Engineering staff have reviewed this request and do not have an issue with updating the south leg of Clinton Street at South Street crosswalk marking to the Zebra Crossing style as long as an agreement is in place with the owner of "Let It Be" for them to pay for the removal of the existing crosswalk marking, installation of the Zebra Crossing style, and any future maintenance.
