The Ad Hoc Downtown Parking Committee had reviewed this item at their March 5, 2018, Recommendation: meeting. They determined that valet parking is no longer needed on Main Street in front of the hotel. A representative from the hotel was present at the meeting and confirmed that valet parking stalls are not used for valet purposes anymore. They have a need for parking to load / unload guests but only for a short period of time. The hotel

representative and committee agreed upon a 30 minute parking designation for the 3 stalls. The following item, ID#18-0388 addresses the approval of 30 minute parking. The Ad Hoc Parking Committee recommends rescinding the previous designation for valet

parking.

Street from 130 feet to 170 feet east of centerline of Clinton Street.

C. ID#18-0389

Rescind resolution from July 17, 1962, establishing a westbound yield sign on Motor Avenue at Greenwood Avenue.

Recommendation:

This item was brought forward by the Department of Public Works and endorsed by Ald. Eric Payne. In 2018, the City will reconstruction Motor Avenue and Fairview Avenue. During the design process, the City plans to realign the intersection of Greenwood Avenue at Motor Avenue and make it more perpendicular. In 1962, a yield sign was established on westbound Motor Avenue at Greenwood. In the proposed reconstructed condition, a yield sign on Motor does not work well for traffic control. Instead, a stop sign on southbound Greenwood is a better traffic control solution. The Department of Public work recommends approval of this item to rescind the yield sign designation.

Recommendation:

This item was brought forward by the Department of Public Works and endorsed by Ald. Eric Payne. In 2018, the City will reconstruction Motor Avenue and Fairview Avenue. During the design process, the City plans to realign the intersection of Greenwood Avenue at Motor Avenue and make it more perpendicular. Staff is recommending a stop sign be placed on southbound Greenwood Avenue at Motor Ave. The Department of Public work recommends approval of this item.

This item was brought forward by the Department of Public Works and endorsed by Ald. Eric Payne. In 2018, the City will reconstruction Motor Avenue and Fairview Avenue. During the design process, staff noticed that many existing parking signs on Motor Avenue are in very poor condition and would need to be replaced. However, as staff researched the resolutions behind the parking zone, it was discovered that some zones date back to the 1960's and are no longer valid. This item is to rescind the 1966 resolution and to allow the area to revert back to open parking. The Department of Public work recommends approval of this item.

However, as staff researched the resolutions behind the parking zone, it was discovered that the zones date back many years and are no longer valid. This item is to rescind the 1993 parking restriction and to allow the area to revert back to open parking. The Department of Public work recommends approval of this item.
