### Subject:

Disallowance of claim for property damage by Bobalou Enterprises.

### **Details:**

Bobalou Enterprises was a pretzel vendor at the 2021 Oktoberfest event. Its trailer was plugged into a generator the City rented from Lincoln Contractor Supply. When Bobalou powered up its equipment, the equipment began to smoke and eventually burned out. The claim seeks replacement value for the equipment. There is no evidence that the City is responsible for the damage to the equipment, it appears to be more likely that Bobalou's trailer's wiring was incorrect, or less likely, that the generator was faulty. Lincioln set up the generator and the City had nothing to do with it.

The claim should be disallowed because there is no proof that the City is responsible for the damage. Disallowance will shorten the period in which Bobalou can file a lawsuit against the City, if it so chooses.

## **Options & Alternatives:**

There are no recommended alternatives.

### **Financial Remarks:**

Disallowance will have no financial impact.

### Staff Recommendation:

City Attorney's Office recommends motion to disallow the claim of Bobalou Enterprises and to authorize the Clerk to issue a formal disallowance letter.

Dear Ms. Kozlik

Bobalou Enterprises LLC, was contracted by the City of Waukesha to participate in, Waukesha Oktoberfest, a two-day event, to sell gourmet pretzels, popcorn, frozen lemonade, soda, and water. The City of Waukesha agreed to supply a 50-amp/220 circuit to my concession trailer. The event was held on Friday, September 24 from 5PM to 11PM and on Saturday September 25 from Noon to 11PM. I was notified to set up my trailer on September 22 at Noon. Upon arrival, the Frame Park supervisor, instructed me where to place my trailer, and where to access power. As is customary, at the conclusion of my set up, I verified that all of my equipment was working. As my event manager and I were making our exit, we encountered Joanna Adamicki, the Special Events Coordinator of the City of Waukesha. At that time, she explained that our power was going to be switched to a generator because I was the only vendor with a long enough cord to access it. On the opening day of the event, Friday September 24, my event manager began his set up by turning on the pretzel warmers. Instantly, they began to smoke, and the power went out. At this time, I received a phone call from him explaining what happened and I referred him to Ms. Adamicki. Ms. Adamicki summoned the electrician to the trailer. Upon his arrival my event manager called me to communicate with the electrician, as to where the main power switch was located. Once explained, the electrician reset the switch and the same problem occurred, the pretzel warmers began smoking and the power in the trailer went out. In an attempt to diagnose the problem further, the pretzel warmers were turned off and the power was reset again. To verify that the pretzel warmers were not causing the issue, the ovens were turned on, and they too began to smoke, and the power turned off again. The ovens were then unplugged, and the power was reset for the third time. At this point it was evident that the problem was stemming from the power source. The electrician and my event manager, walked to the generator to find that the amperage meter was rising from 50 amps to 65 amps. The electrician was unable to identify the cause of the power outages and suggested plugging in four extension cords to individually power each appliance. Unfortunately, this plan did not work as the equipment was already damaged and was unable to turn back on.

Ms. Adamicki offered two small pieces of equipment to finish vending for the rest of the day. The borrowed equipment was plugged into a different power source with individual extension cords. As it got dark, my event manager turned the trailer lights on, and the power blew out again, even without the appliances plugged in. Ultimately, the event closed early on Friday due to rain. I instructed my employee to remove all products from the trailer, due to the risk of power issues. I notified Ms. Adamicki that we were no longer able to vend at the event, given that all of our equipment was destroyed. I returned to the park at 11:30 PM on Saturday September 25, to remove my trailer from the event grounds. As I was doing so, I encountered Ms. Adamicki, and explained to her that I was going to have a professional inspect the equipment and inform her of their findings.

After the event, I took the equipment to Wisco Industries Inc., the manufacturer of the appliances, in Oregon, Wisconsin. Two weeks later, I was informed that the electrical issues damaged both warmers beyond repair, and the replacement value for the warmers is \$1,200.00 each. They were able to repair the ovens, at a cost of \$54.87. I consulted an electrician to assess the damage on the trailer, and it was determined that the controller that operates the lights was also totaled beyond repair. The value of this switch is \$400.00. When I received this information, I contacted Ms. Adamicki, who then informed me to contact the generator supplier. This was my first-time hearing that the generator came from an outside source.

I own three trailers, which have been in commission for five years, all with no previous issues. At this time, we are only interested in recovering the \$2,854.87, which is the amount of repairing/replacing our equipment, and not recouping any loss of revenue.
