### **CLEAN WATER PLANT:**

- DNR monthly Discharge Monitoring Report for May submitted.
- WPDES permit inspection report received from DNR.
- DNR completed review of draft ordinance changes.
- Bio-assay testing for permit in May passed.
- Reported to DNR weekly permit limit for Chloride exceeded for the month of May.
- DNR Compliance Maintenance Annual Report approved by Council. Sixth year in a row CWP has attained straight "A" rating.
- CWP main entry compromised by return flow pipe work on Sentry Drive.
- Return flow pump installs mostly complete.
- Electrical work continues for return flow pump station.
- Return Flow pump station generator load tested.
- Contractor continues working on punch list for phosphorus upgrades.
- Staff attended Central States Water Environment Federation collection systems seminar.
- Interviews for open Maintenance Operator position.
- Interviews for open Seasonal position.
- Staff responded to power outages from storm June 13. Nine stations were affected.
- Sewer crew responded to sewer back-ups on Racine Ave. after June 13 storm. Pretreatment investigating potential I/I sources and flushing of wipes in the area.
- Centrifuge bowl removed for routine manufacturer rebuild
- CWP main gas meter replaced by WE Energies.

TRANSIT:

- 2022 capital projects-Bus 178 has been delivered. It is the first Metro bus with a bike rack. The replacement SUV for administration is complete but there has been a delay in delivery due to lack of freight haulers, so delivery is now likely in mid to late June. Mobile lifts are on order and is forecasted for delivery in August. The first set of engines and transmissions will be delivered in the near future for the bus mid-life rehab project.
- The Route 1 extension to the Regional Medical Center in Wauwatosa is expected to start in late Spring 2023. An agreement for the extension in Milwaukee County has been executed. The additional buses needed for the service are ordered and Gillig will be providing production dates in the near future.
- Transit staff is evaluating the offer from Milwaukee County to join their new Fare Payment System UMO and WisGo app. Much more information will be shared on the evaluation of UMO in the near future.
- Working to implement plans for the Bus Bay re-assignments at the Transit Center and minor routing adjustments related to the North St two-way project.
- SEWRPC is working to complete of 2023-2027 Transit Development Plan. A final Advisory Committee meeting and public outreach will be conducted prior to the plan being brought forth for consideration. The target is to have the plan completed and approved by end of this Summer.
- Submitted applications for future year buses through CMAQ and STP funding cycles. Awards will be announced this Summer.
- Transmitted the 2022 Federal grant funding application and it is now in review with the FTA.
- Annual National Transit Database Report for 2021 has passed and is in the validation cycle.
- Submitted transit projects updates related to the SEWRPC Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) for 2023-2026.
- Working on the Waukesha County Transit Operating budget for 2023.
