





WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The Joseph Project, an initiative that provides job training and transportation to work for low-income Milwaukee residents, expanded to Waukesha County. Three New Berlin employers purchased a van to transport employees from Milwaukee to family-supporting jobs in the manufacturing industry. 4 people have been hired already.

450 students from 16 high schools in Waukesha County visited the Many Futures in Health Care Career Expo on Friday, March 24, 2017 at Waukesha County Technical College.
