

SHRUB PLANTING NOTES

PRUNING SHOULD BE ONLY FOR SHAPING PURPOSES.

1. PRUNING - CLEANLY PRUNE DAMAGED BRANCHES AND ROOTS AT THIS TIME. ADDITIONAL

SHRUB PLANTING DETAIL

-REMOVE PLANT FROM CONTAINER,

PLANT ROOT BALL AT GRADE AT WHICH

- DOUBLE SHREDDED HARDWOOD MULCH,

CONTINUOUS 3" SAUCER TO CONTAIN

(NOTE SHRUBS ON SLOPES SHALL BE

- BACKFILL (1/2 EXISTING SOIL, 1/2 PLANTING

WATER AND TAMP TO REMOVE AIR

- USE SHOVEL TO ROUGH UP EXPOSED

WALLS OF PLANTING PIT.

- EXISTING UNDISTURBED SUBSOIL

SAUCERED ON THE DOWNHILL SIDE.)

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- BACKFILL, WATER AND TAMP TO REMOVE AIR POCKETS - EXISTING UNDISTURBED SUBSOIL - USE SHOVEL TO ROUGH UP EXPOSED WALLS OF PLANTING PIT. - SET STAKES A MINIMUM OF 12 INCHES INTO SUBSOIL - CUT AND REMOVE BURLAP OR WIRE FROM

TOP 1/2 OF ROOT BALL (AFTER PLACED IN

SIDE.) - FINISH GRADE TOPSOIL

- DOUBLE SHREDDED HARDWOOD MULCH 3 INCHES THICK. MULCH SHALL NOT TOUCH TRUNK - CONTINUOUS 3 INCH SAUCER TO CONTAIN WATER AND MULCH (NOTE EVERGREEN TREES ON SLOPES SHALL BE SAUCERED ON THE DOWNHILL

- ROOT COLLAR TO BE I TO 2 INCHES ABOVE FINISH GRADE, REMOVE SOIL FROM TOP OF BALL AS NECESSARY TO EXPOSE ROOT COLLAR.

PLANTING, NEVER LEAVE "V" CROTCHES OR DOUBLE LEADER. - DOUBLE STRAND WIRE THREADED THROUGH METAL GROMMET TO SECURE TRUNK TO STAKE

- DO NOT CUT LEADER - DAMAGED OR DEAD WOOD MAY BE REMOVED IMMEDIATLEY PRIOR TO

4. WATERING - THE BACKFILL AND ROOTS OF ALL NEWLY SET PLANT MATERIAL SHOULD BE WATERED AS BACKFILLING IS DONE SO THE SOIL AND ROOTS ARE THOROUGHLY SOAKED.

PRUNING SHOULD BE ONLY FOR SHAPING PURPOSES. 3. PLANTING - ALL SYNTHETIC MATERIAL SHOULD BE REMOVED FROM THE ROOTS, TRUNK, OR CROWN OF PLANT. SET THE PLANT SO IT WILL BE AT ITS ORIGINAL DEPTH SLIGHTLY ABOVE EXISTING GRADE, BACKFILL WITH SPECIFIED SOIL MIX.

MONTHS FOR BINDING OR OTHER PROBLEMS. STAKES AND TIES SHOULD BE REMOVED SIX MONTHS TO ONE YEAR AFTER PLANTING. 2. PRUNING - CLEANLY PRUNE ONLY DAMAGED BRANCHES AND ROOTS AT THIS TIME. ADDITIONAL


1. STAKING - ONLY EVERGREEN TREES THAT ARE UNABLE TO REMAIN UPRIGHT AFTER PLANTING SHALL BE STAKED, EVERGREEN TREES WILL BECOME STRONGER FASTER WHEN THE TOP 2/3 OF THE EVERGREEN TREE 16 FREE TO SWAY. TIE WEBBED STRAPPING TO THE TREE 1/3 UP THE TRUNK AND WIRE TO THREE STAKES POSITIONED EVENLY AROUND THE EVERGREEN TREE. STAKES SHOULD BE DRIVEN DEEPLY INTO THE GROUND TO PREVENT DISLODGING. CHECK AT LEAST EVERY THREE

4. WATERING - THE BACKFILL AND ROOTS OF ALL NEWLY SET PLANT MATERIAL SHOULD BE

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


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WHEN THE TOP 2/3 OF THE TREE IS FREE TO SWAY. 2. PRUNING - CLEANLY PRUNE DAMAGED BRANCHES AND ROOTS AT THIS TIME. ADDITIONAL PRUNING SHOULD BE ONLY FOR SHAPING PURPOSES.

MULTI-STEM TREE STAKING AND PLANTING NOTES 1. STAKING - MULTI-STEM TREES SHALL NOT BE STAKED. TREES WILL BECOME STRONGER FASTER
