City Administrator Highlights

Week of February 5:

- Held a Public Information Meeting regarding the Whiterock Redevelopment and Frame Park Enhancements proposal.
- Held the fourth of twelve sessions of this round of the City's Leadership Class. We have 11
 employees going through the program this round.
- Held a Director's Meeting with all Department Directors. Part of the meeting was discussing some of the principles that are being taught in the City's Leadership Class.
- Held meetings regarding the baseball proposal for Frame Park and Whiterock Redevelopment.
- Held regularly scheduled meetings with Rich Abbott, Fred Abadi, Chief Howard, and Chris Pofahl.

Clerk/Treasure Updates

- In-Office Absentee began February 5th and continues through February 16th. Through February 14, 2018, there were a total of 114 voters who voted during In-Office Absentee. Of the 912 mailed Absentee ballots, 323 have been returned as of February 15, 2018.
- Prepared polling material, election supplies, and voting machines for the Spring Primary, which are delivered by Department of Public Works to each polling location on February 19, 2018.



- Gina conducted a Chief Election Inspector meeting on February 16th to review guidelines and laws, and to discuss any situations which may occur during the February 20th Election.
- Online & mail-in voter registration is currently open for the April 3rd Election. The deadline to register online and via mail is March 14th. After that date, registrations must be submitted in person at the Clerk-Treasurer's Office for the April 3rd Election.
- Issued a Reserve "Class B" liquor license to Casa Tequila Restaurant, located on Kossow Road, on February 12, 2018. This is the first Reserve liquor license our office has issued.
- On February 23rd, liquor license renewal packets will be mailed to approximately 150 establishments holding a liquor license. Renewal applications are due Friday, April 6, 2018.
- The Lottery Credit report for mobile homes was submitted to the County for reimbursement from the State.
- An additional \$55,000 in tax payment refunds have been issued to individuals who had mortgage company overpayments. Approximately \$300,000 has been refunded for the 2017 tax year.

Police Department

In January of 2015, the Waukesha Police Department implemented a drug disposal program
that encourages citizens to drop off their unused and unwanted prescription drugs and
medications. The goal of this program is to provide citizens with a safe, secure and
anonymous location to dispose of medications and ensure that they don't end up in the
wrong hands. During its first operational year, the Waukesha Police Department collected
151 pounds of prescription drugs and medications. In 2017, the Waukesha Police
Department collected 1,283 pounds of prescription drugs and medications. This program
has created a safer Waukesha community.

Transit:

- New security cameras are being installed on the concourse at the Transit Center.
- Fixed Route ridership decreased 2.1% to 630,003 in 2017. Overall the system had 12.13 passengers per hour of service.
- Metrolift ridership decreased 8.4% to 9,693 in 2017. Despite the decrease, passengers per hour of service increased 22% to 2.15 due to new software that modernized scheduling and dispatching of Metrolift trips.
- Fixed route ridership for January 2018 increased 6.3% and Metrolift ridership decreased 2.9%.
- New Route 2, 3 and 15 schedules took effect February 19th. Changes included adding earlier weekday service to Big Bend Rd., having the first Route 3/15 serve Meijer on Saturday mornings and eliminating of the Route 2 8:50 pm trip on Saturdays.

Streets Division:

- Asphalt patch work continues.
- Compost processing continues.
- Salt barrels being placed and refilled throughout winter.
- Sign installation/removal approved by Sign Review Committee continues.
- Repair/replacement of knock downs (lights, signs, & traffic signals) continues.
- Mechanics repairing and maintaining city fleet.
