City Administrator Highlights

- Thanks to everyone for participating in the strategic plan interview sessions. Patrick is compiling all the information he gathered and is working on putting together an agenda for our two-day workshop on March 26 and 27. We will get the agenda for the workshop out to you by mid-March. Please plan that the workshop will be the full day (8am-4pm) both days.
- I attended a meeting with the County Public Works Director to discuss their timeline for remodeling of their courthouse to see if there might be any possibilities for working together.
- Held a session of the City employee leadership class. We are half-way through the program with this Leadership Class.
- Along with a number of staff attended Emergency Operations Center Training put on by the Police Department. This training allowed us to test our set-up and operations should there be an incident that requires an Emergency Operations Center.
- Held discussions with the Mayor and Community Development on ways we can better engage and work with the Downtown businesses.
- Held discussions regarding a potential new way to bring a baseball team to Waukesha.
- Held a Director's Meeting with all Department Directors.
- Held regularly scheduled meetings with Rich Abbott, Fred Abadi, Chief Howard, Chief Jack, and Chris Pofahl.
- This upcoming week we will be holding a kick-off meeting with BWBR the firm hired to create a partial design for a new and remodeled City Hall.

Clerk/Treasure Updates

- The Municipal Board of Canvassers met the afternoon of Wednesday, February 21st to canvass the votes from the Spring Primary and certify the results. The Municipal Court Judge candidates advancing to the Spring Election will be Steven Wimmer and Nicholas Martinez.
- The total average turnout for the Spring Primary was 17.45%. The poll locations with the highest turnout were South High School (22%), Bethesda (21%) and Fire Station #5 (21%).



- Clerk staff began recording voter participation and new registrations into the WisVote statewide voter database from the Spring Primary Election. Voters can access their individual voting history record at www.MyVote.wi.gov.
- The Spring Election will be held on Tuesday, April 3rd. The deadline for Voters to register to vote online or by mail for the upcoming election is Wednesday March 14th. Absentee ballots for those voters having requests on file with the Clerk's office will be mailed on March 13th.
- Second installment tax payments are due on March 31st. With that being a Saturday, the due date will be extended into election week.

Community Development

Parks Department

- The Forestry division continues a focus on removing trees infested with Emerald Ash Borer (EAB).

- The Department has hired a new volunteer coordinator, April Dehloff.
- Youth Softball, T-ball, and baseball sign-ups run until April 19th.

Police Department
