## (6) OVERNIGHT PARKING. (Am. #40-90) (Am. #13-16)

- (a) For purposes of this Section, Central Business District means the area bounded by the following streets in the City of Waukesha, including both sides of the streets: Beginning at the intersection of Wisconsin and East Avenues, north to Main Street, west to Barstow Street, north to North Street, southwesterly to Wisconsin Avenue, and east to the point of beginning.
- (b) No person, except one operating an authorized emergency vehicle as defined in Wis.Stat.Sec. 340.01(3) a physician while on an emergency calls, shall park any vehicle on any street within the Central Business District for more than 30 minutes between the hours of 2 a.m. and 5 a.m.; except for Ann Street; Fuller Street; Martin Street; Maple Avenue between Wisconsin Avenue and Main Street; and South Street between Martin Street and East Avenue.
- (c) No person, except one operating an authorized emergency vehicle as defined in Wis.Stat.Sec. 340.01(3) a physician while on an emergency calls, shall park any vehicle on any street outside of the Central Business District or on Ann Street; Fuller Street; Martin Street; Maple Avenue between Wisconsin Avenue and Main Street; or South Street between Martin Street and East Avenue; between the hours of 2 a.m. and 5 a.m., unless:
  - (i) An overnight-parking permit has been obtained from the Police Department, or designated 24-hour retail establishments or designated online website. The permit shall be displayed on the rear-view mirror within the vehicle or affixed to the front or rear windshield as designated on the permit when the vehicle is parked on the street between 2 a.m. and 5 a.m., so that the information on the permit is visible through the appropriate front or rear windshield. (Am. #52-03) (Am. #19-04)
    - (A) Vehicles with <u>overnight-parking</u> permits shall be parked on the even-numbered side of the street on the even-numbered days and on the odd-numbered side of the street on odd-numbered days, except on streets where parking is permitted on only one side at any time. The date at 2 a.m. to 5 a.m. shall determine the even or the odd number of the day.
    - **(B)** Vehicles with <u>overnight-parking permits may shall</u> be parked <u>in any area of the city except the Central Business District or as otherwise prohibited by official <u>sign.</u> within 100 feet of the address shown on the permit, measured from the lot line at the curb.</u>

(C) Night parking permits on the following streets shall be issued only to residents of those streets: (Cr. #23-91) (Am. #34-98) (Am. #42-06)

McCall Street, from East Avenue to James Street

James Street, from McCall Street to College Avenue

Charles Street, from McCall Street to College Avenue

College Avenue, from James Street to Charles Street from September 1st to May 15<sup>th</sup> James Street, from McCall Street to Newhall

Charles Street, from McCall Street to Newhall

East Laflin Avenue, from Wilbur Avenue to Hartwell Avenue

(ii) Only motor vehicles with a gross vehicle weight under 10,000 lbs. are eligible for overnight-parking permits. Boats and trailers are not eligible for overnight-parking permits.

(iii) Fees for overnight-parking permits shall be as follows: (Am. #2-12)

Three-night <u>parking</u> permit - \$4.00 Monthly parking permit - \$12.00 Three-month <u>parking</u> permit - \$30.00 <u>Annual parking permit - \$120.00</u>

- (iv) In addition to the above parking permit fees, depending on how or where purchased, there may be an additional convenience or processing fee imposed.
- (v) Annual overnight-parking permits shall be valid for the calendar year commencing January 1st and ending December 31<sup>st</sup>. The fee for such annual permit shall not be pro-rated if purchased subsequent to January 1st of the given calendar year.
- (viiv) An overnight-parking permit shall be issued to a specific vehicle and shall not be transferrable to other vehicles only be issued to a resident, or a guest of a resident, at the address shown on the permit. (Cr. #47-03)
- (d) If parking is prohibited on a particular side of a street at any time by sign or by other provision of this Section, an <u>nightovernight</u>-parking permit will not authorize parking on that side.
- (e) If parking is prohibited on a street, an <u>over</u>night-parking permit will not authorize parking on that street.
- (f) <u>Overn</u>Night parking is not permitted on City streets during snow emergencies, regardless of whether a vehicle has an <u>over</u>night-parking permit-or not.
- (g) Signs giving notice of the provisions of the Section shall be placed at the City limits on all state and county trunk highways, and connecting streets as defined in Wis. Stats. §84.02(11). The signs shall be reflectorized and of a type approved by the State Department of Transportation as to size of lettering, shape and color.
- (h) Exemptions. The following will be exempt from the permit requirements, fees and restrictions set forth in subsections (b) through (d) above: (Cr. #56-94)
  - (i) Any motor vehicle bearing a special registration plate issued under Wis. Stats. \$341.14(1) or (1r)(a) to a disabled veteran or on his or her behalf;
  - (ii) Any motor vehicle bearing special registration plates issued under Wis. Stats. §341.14(1a), (1e), (1m), or (1q), or (1r)(a), or motor vehicle other than a motorcycle upon which a special identification card issued after July 1, 1994 under Wis. Stats. §343.51 is displayed;
  - (iii) Any motor vehicle registered in another jurisdiction, upon which is displayed a registration plate, card or emblem issued by the other jurisdiction, designating the vehicle as a vehicle used by a physically-disabled person.

(iv) Vehicles described in this subsection (h) shall be parked within 100 feet of the residence of the person to whom the special registration plates, cards or emblems were issued, or the property that the owner of the vehicle is visiting, measured from the lot line at the curb.
