Subject:

Rescind resolution from August 16, 1966 establishing 4 hr parking, 8am to 8pm, on south side of Motor Avenue from Washington Ave to Greenwood Ave. Said area will revert back to open parking.

Details:

This item was brought forward by the Department of Public Works and endorsed by Ald. Eric Payne. In 2018, the City will reconstruction Motor Avenue and Fairview Avenue. During the design process, staff noticed that many existing parking signs on Motor Avenue are in very poor condition and would need to be replaced. However, as staff researched the resolutions behind the parking zone, it was discovered that some zones date back to the 1960's and are no longer valid. This item is to rescind the 1966 resolution and to allow the area to revert back to open parking.

The B&G Committee reviewed this item and unanimously approve it.

Options & Alternatives:

Keep the old parking zone and spend up to \$400 replacing the signs which are in poor condition and incur ongoing maintenance of signs.

Since old parking zone is no longer necessary, removal of the signs and posts and having no further signs to maintain is the preferred solution.

Financial Remarks:

The signs from the old parking zone will be removed by the construction contractor or by City garage staff at no cost.

Executive Action:

If approved by Council, a resolution document covering all items listed will need to be executed by the Mayor and Clerk after the Council Meeting.

Committee Recommendation:

The Buildings and Grounds Committee approved this item at their March 19, 2018, meeting and will appear under the Consent Agenda for the April 5, 2018, Council meeting.
