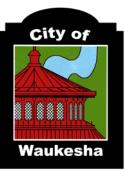

#### Subject:

Review and act on the consultants for Surveying Services for 2018 and 2019 Municipal Construction Projects.

#### Details:

The Department of Public Works solicited for proposals for consultants to provide Surveying Services for 2018-2019 municipal construction projects. Three firms responded to the Request for Proposals for Professional Services. The City's Review Committee evaluated the three responses and chose Jahnke & Jahnke Associates, Inc., and Cedar Corporation. Jahnke & Jahnke had the lowest overall cost and Cedar Corp. the second lowest. The hourly fee schedule for labor and expenses from the proposals is attached.

The total expense for the survey work for 2018 is expected to be \$36,300. The hourly fee schedule for the consultants is listed below:
