New Perspective Waukesha, SE Corner of Broadway and Les Paul Parkway – Preliminary Site Plan & Architectural Review

Details:

New Perspective Waukesha is requesting a preliminary approval for Site Plan and Architectural review for a new Senior Living Facility at the southeast corner of E. Broadway and Les Paul Parkway. The 128 unit facility is proposed to be constructed on a 6.7 acre site. The building will be broken down into 92 Senior apartments and 36 memory care units. The structure will be three stories encompassing 155,544 sq. ft. with 17,176 sq. ft. of underground parking. Amenities include a large 2 story lobby and reception area, several dining venues, and a wellness center. The memory care wing uses a neighborhood design, surrounded by courtyards, with an open kitchen, living room, and exercise room. The main access will be off of E. Broadway with secondary access and egress available through the current church entrance off of Les Paul Parkway. A total of 121 parking spaces will be provided (86 surface, and 35 underground spaces) with space identified for 101 additional spaces if needed. Architecture will consist of a fiber cement siding with brick and stone veneer. Staff suggests four sided architecture with an equal treatment of the brick and stone carried around to all four sides of the building comparable to the west elevation.
