	The City of Waukesha is the largest municipality in the County of Waukesha and has been uCDBG funds for more than 20 years. The Engineering Department manages all construction

g projects for the City, therefore has the experience needed to continue managing CDBG projects.

  - 1. First Priority: The instersection of E. Broadway, N. Hartwell Ave, and Lincoln Ave has been a challenge for Pedestrians, as well as drivers to navigate thru the intersection safely. The City proposes to enhance the pedestrian facilities in the intersection. New ped buttons and pedestrian signal heads with upgraded curb ramps will be installed. Cost of this is \$83,000 2. Grandview Park Playground will have a new resilient surface installed. The playground is approx. 4,000 sq. ft. based on \$12/sq. ft. cost would be \$48,000.
