

The Northwestern Hotel is a two-story Queen Anne-styled brick commercial structure located opposite the Victorian-styled Milwaukee and Madison Depot, known locally as the Depot Restaurant, now owned by "Saz and Pep". The Northwestern Hotel is commonly known as the Club 400. It's facade is dominated by a splendid metal cornice which culminates in a rounded pediment. The eaves line below the cornice features a series of heavy brackets, punctuated by several highly detailed rosettes. Stone lintels support the 3 tall, symmetrically located front-facing windows, while decorative brick work calls attention to the semi-circular spandrels which cap them. Stone corbel stops adorn the base of the spandrel arch as well.

The first floor has undergone some substantial remodelings over time. The most recent one was done with a design prepared by consultant Robert Hartmann of Racine, WI. at the direction of the Landmarks Commission. The first floor area is consequently much improved, and the building's owner, Daniel Pokwinski, has faithfully followed the recommended historic paint scheme. As a result, the historic Northwestern Hotel has retaken its' rightful place among Waukesha's best and brightest historic resources.
