WCTC hosts collection event for electronics

WAUKESHA — A one-day event for collecting and disposing household electronics and appliances will be held at the Waukesha County Technical College's Pewaukee campus at 800 Main St. on Saturday, Nov. 9 from 9 a.m. to noon.

"We are pleased to have Waukesha County Technical College's support to help residents dispose these household items properly," said Analiese Smith, Recycling & Solid Waste supervisor for Waukesha County.

The event will take place near the college's "W" building in parking lots 19 and 20. Some items require paying a fee before collecting. TVs smaller than 32

inches are \$30 and tube TVs larger than 32 inches require a \$70 fee. Items including laptops, cell-phones, air conditioners, refrigerators and microwaves are free to drop off.

Wisconsin state law bans the disposal of appliances and electronics in landfills. Some of the electronics accepted at the event contain reusable metals and hazardous materials. Lead, mercury and chromium are a few of the commonly used materials that require proper disposal.

Damaged or de-manufactured TVs and computers cannot be dropped off. Some Waukesha businesses, such as Recycle Technologies and Best Buy, accept various electronics for a fee.
