Disallowance of claim for damages to car, filed by Carol Williams.

Details:

Carol Williams was driving her car southbound on White Rock Avenue, i.e., going from the Moreland Boulevard intersection towards downtown. Perkins Avenue intersects White Rock just before the railroad crossing, and Ms. Williams made a left turn from White Rock onto Perkins. There are median barriers on White Rock and Perkins at the intersection, and Ms. Williams drove over the median barrier on Perkins, damaging the exhaust system on her car. She claims \$1010.19 in total damages.

Ms. Williams believes the city is liable because she feels that the median is not visible and is an unreasonable hazard in the roadway. She points out that there are many, many marks on the median that indicate that it s run over frequently.

Her claim and some photos she took accompany this cover sheet.

I made an investigation and took some photos, too, and they also accompany this cover sheet.

The median barriers are essentially a curb in the middle of the street. They are about 6 inches in height. The barriers are required to be in both Perkins and White Rock in order for the city to qualify for a railroad "quiet zone." The purpose of the barriers is to prevent drivers from swerving out of their lanes to get around railroad crossing gates. If the barriers were not there, then trains would be required to sound their horns at crossings. They have to be there.

Perkins Avenue is adjacent to the Renaissance Manufacturing Group factory, the former International Harvester foundry. The main truck entrance to the factory is off Perkins, so there's a lot of semi truck traffic turning from White Rock onto Perkins, the same turn that Ms. Williams made. Because of the configuration of the intersection, it's impossible for trucks to make that turn without crossing the median barrier, it's physically impossible. That accounts for the marks that Ms. Williams mentions in her claim. The trucks also swing wide making that turn, and there are tire tracks on the far side of the street where the trucks go up over the curb to make the turn. It's a tight spot, and because the railroad tracks are right there, there's not a lot of room for changing the configuration. Take a look at the photos and you'll see all of this.

Ms. Williams states that there is no street lighting at the intersection, however, my inspection shows that there is. In fact, there is a light almost directly over the median barrier.

It looks like Ms. Williams simply cut the corner short and just didn't see the barrier. I don't find that the median barrier is hard to see. It's not something you expect to see, but I've personally not had any trouble seeing it when making that turn. In spite of the marks that show it is run over frequently, I'm not aware that any other complaints about it or claims have been made.

Because there are definitely issues about Ms. Williams's failure to see the barrier, I recommend that the claim be disallowed. Ms. Williams (or her insurance company) can file suit, and all of the legal issues can be sorted out.

This is the approach to the left turn from White Rock to Perkins, as seen from southbound White Rock.



This is the view from White Rock onto Perkins, right at the point where the left turn would begin. The median barriers in both White Rock and Perkins are visible. Note the semi tire tracks going around the corner and leading to the median barrier.



This is the median barrier in Perkins Avenue, where Ms. Williams would have driven over it. Semi tire tracks are visible. You can also see the tire ruts in the snow at the far curb where truck drivers had to swing wide to make the turn.



This is the view up Perkins Avenue. Note the tracks over the barrier extend for 20 to 25 feet up the barrier.



This is the view up Perkins Avenue, showing the RMG truck lot in the background and tire ruts in the foreground.



This view is from Perkins towards White Rock, with the railroad tracks and Frame Park in the background. Note the street light on the utility pole, just below the crossarms and directly above the barrier.



This is the view up Perkins Avenue, with the railroad crossing gate lowered. This view shows why the median barrier is needed, to deter vehicles from trying to go around the lowered gate.


