## Hamilton groups recycle devices for gorilla habitat

HAMILTON – The Hamilton High School's Club Action and Science Club groups have teamed up with 39 zoos and one aquarium to spread awareness on gorilla conservation. The groups recycled mobile phones and handheld electronics in the name of the cause.

the mineral coltan, which is mined from endangered gorilla habitats and affects their environment. Recycling the devices helps those metals get reused.

Community members are encouraged to contribute to the recycling efforts by bringing old devices to the high school. Collection bins are in the school library and several classrooms. Each home basketball game will also have a collection station at the admissions table. The campaign will run until mid-April.
