Kiwanis tree sale postponed

OCONOMOWOC — The 22nd annual Kiwanis tree sale has been moved to May 23 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A release states the new date is subject to change as well.

Sale locations will be the same as before, including: Piggy Wiggly, 1300 Brown St., Oconomowoc; and BP Station, W1168 Highway 16, Ixonia.

The sale will take place from 8 a.m. until the trees are sold out.

Black Hills spruce and white pine will again be available. Large trees that are 16 inches to 18 inches are \$6 each while small trees that are 9 inches to 14 inches are \$3 each.

Presales are encouraged as last year's trees were sold out by 10 a.m.

I-94 high-speed chase ends in Waukesha crash

WAUKESHA — The Delafield Police Department took an adult man into custody following a police chase on Interstate 94 on Tuesday.

Police Chief Erik Kehl said there was a reckless driver in a white four-door sedan that was called in by either Dane or Jefferson County.

"It was headed east, they had terminated their pursuit," he said. "Two of our officers went up (and) observed the vehicle still driving recklessly at a very high rate of speed."

Kehl said at about 12:40

p.m. they initiated tire deflation devices along I-94 at the overpass along Meadow Brook Road in Pewaukee.

"The vehicle ended up crashing into the gore at the ramp from I-94 Eastbound to Grandview by Highway K," he said.

Kehl said they are working to confirm the man's identity.
