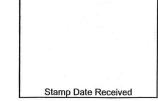


## City of Waukesha Department of Community Development BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS 201 Delafield Street, Waukesha, WI 53188

The appeal or application must be filed with the Community Development Department at least 17 days before the Board's meeting and within 20 days of the Zoning Inspector's order or decision, accompanied by the filing fee of \$100.00.

## **Fence Variance**

In regards to the front yard fence for 2404 Summit Ave, we believe it is in our best interest to leave the fence as is. We have a special needs daughter. We feel she will be safest if we do not have spaces between the pickets. Our daughter Remington does not know the strength she has when it comes to "grabbing and feeling" We are worried about the possibility of a dog or other pet sticking their head between the pickets. If our daughter grabbed the ears of the pet, and felt too hard, (because she doesn't really know her strength), she could be bitten. Below are some reasons that we hope you will take into consideration in moving forward with our case.

- 1. Some special circumstances that apply directly to our property in regards to this issue. Our house is located on a hill and most of the front yard is visible from the sidewalk and the street. This is for our daughters protection as she has apraxia.
- 2. All neighboring properties have a full view into our yard. The fence does not restrict any view from down the street either.
- 3. The variance is requested for our daughter's safety, not property value. For example, the possibility of a dog, friendly or not, biting.
- 4. We feel that for the safety of our daughter, it is best to have the fence constructed with no space between the pickets. We strongly feel we have a legitimate reason for wanting our fence to be constructed this way.
- 5. No neighboring properties have complained to us about our fence. Our house is on a hill and the fence is not to create privacy. As the fence is now, there is a full view of our house and most of the yard.

We ask that you consider our circumstances. The reason we built our fence is for protection for our children. Specifically our daughter with apraxia.
