Waukesha Public Library offers new puzzle exchange

WAUKESHA — The Waukesha Public Library is offering a new jigsaw trade-in for all residents of the city.

The program is simple: Anyone can walk into the library, drop off a puzzle at the exchange, then pick up a new puzzle to bring home. There's no need to stop by the checkout desk, residents can take advantage of the program as many times as they want, and the entire process is socially distanced.

Library Director Bruce Gay said this new trade-in is just another way in which the library is trying to meet the needs of the community.

“The demand has been there,” Gay said. “And puzzles are expensive.”

The library also offers the ability to checkout zoo passes, as well as virtual reading programs, for anyone looking for low-cost ways to pass the time while social distancing.

Gay said that these programs are very popular, and so anyone interested in using the exchange can do so at the library, which is located at 321 Wisconsin Ave. in Waukesha.
