Public Works

ENGINEERING DIVISION:

New City Hall

- We have officially moved into the new City Hall. The old city hall is currently being emptied and the asbestos abatement began on Monday Feb 1.
- The contractor continues work on demolition.

New Public Works Salt Shed

- The contractor finished the installation of the concrete walls.
- The roof framing has been installed on the salt shed. The membrane and the large over head doors have been ordered and will arrive shortly.

Buchner Pool

- The contractor has poured nearly all the exterior concrete that needs to be poured before Spring. In the Spring they will be able to begin work on the tile in the pool vessels.
- The building is moving along. It has been enclosed to allow interior work on floors, plumbing and HVAC to continue. The exterior stone work continues.

West Side Pump Station Consolidation

This project is for the consolidation of four existing sanitary pump stations (PS) into one on the west side of the City in the vicinity of Les Paul Pkwy (US 318) and Madison St.

- The contractor will continue the upgrades at the Madison St Pump Station
- The contractor will continue working on the sewer heading north of Madison St along Pebble Creek
- The contractor continues the bore under Summit Ave

CLEAN WATER PLANT:

- Preparing February DNR monthly Discharge Monitoring Report.
- Impact Fee analysis draft completed.
- Return Flow pump station wet well and foundation walls almost complete.
- Electrical work for upgrades continues throughout plant.
- Chemical solids recycle improvements underway.
- Staff training on new confined space gas monitors.
- Truck scale system PC upgraded
- Working on change to softener optimization program to accelerate progress of high water users.
- WE Energies electrical switch that caught fire replaced.
- City owned electrical switchgear inspected.
- Kick-off meeting held for south side lift station consolidation design.
- New effluent compliance sampler installed.
- Standby Generators repaired and PMs set for 2021

TRANSIT:

- Roughly 25% of the transit staff that requested the COVID vaccine have been fully vaccinated. Await direction for the remaining Transit employees to be able to get vaccinated.
- The following changes to Waukesha Metro continue due to the COVID-19 pandemic:
 - Capacity on the buses remains at 15 passengers.
 - Unlimited riding/joy riding is suspended.
 - Lost and found is limited to only essential personal items.
- The aging Transit fueling management system is being replaced with the City Fueling System, FuelMaster, so that all City fleet vehicles will be on the same system. The fuel pump equipment at Badger Drive is also being replaced. This has been delayed a few months due to equipment production delays due to COVID and is now targeted for completion in Spring 2021.
- Transit staff is working with SEWRPC on the 2022-2026 Transit Development Plan. Potential alternatives are being developed after receiving direction from the Advisory Committee.
- The 2021 fixed route buses are in production and expected to be delivered in late March 2021.
- The new supervisor van is ready for service. It also can be used as a paratransit vehicle as well.
