WAUKESHA — The Waukesha Public Library will host An Evening on Mango Street at the Waukesha Civic Theatre on Wednesday as part of their Waukesha Reads events.

The current Waukesha Reads Novel, “The House on Mango Street,” is a 1984 novel by Mexican-American author Sandra Cisneros. The novel is structured as a series of vignettes and tells the story of a 12-year-old Chicana girl growing up in the Hispanic quarter of Chicago.

According to the Waukesha Public Library, the public is invited to enjoy Mexican tapas while perusing art from La Casa de Esperanza at 5 p.m.

At 6 p.m. they can head

into the auditorium for “Finding Home: A Waukesha Reads Cabaret”, which is inspired by “The House on Mango Street”. The public can settle back and go on a journey to find home through stories and songs performed by Candace Decker and Phil Smith.

At 7:15 p.m., a performance from Milwaukee’s Ballet Folklórico will take place. The evening will include trick roping stunts and theatrical Mexican dancers, lighting up the stage with dazzling costumes and colorful depictions of Mexico’s diverse culture and folklore.
