2022 Library Budget Information

On November 2, 2021, the Waukesha Common Council approved the City budget, including the Library's budget request of \$4,036,737. This is an increase of 0.37% (under 1%) from the 2021 estimated budget of \$4,021,784. The major budgeted departments are as follows:

The remaining approximately \$167,000 in expenditures comes from the Resource Library contract, the Waukesha Reads and Children's grants, and the Café Administrator contract through Bridges.

In addition to the operating budget, the Council had earlier approved a capital budget request for the Library, which in 2022 will include:

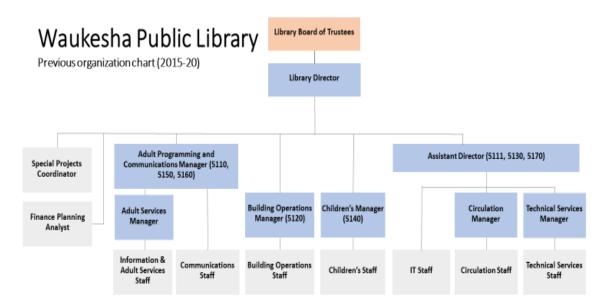
• Completing the first-floor renovation: \$260,000

Roof replacement, first year of two: \$710,000

• Backup generator: \$168,000

Library computer technology: \$51,000

Issues

- · Inconsistent publicity for library programs.
- · Adult and Children's programs not coordinated.
- . Three managers responsible for aspects of managing library collection.
- · Additional IT support needed.
- Managers (in blue) did not report to Library Director



Features of new structure:

- New structure better meets both changing community needs and renovated library space.
- Flatter organization—all managers report directly to the library director.
- Managers directly responsible for one budget org.
- Community engagement—outreach and programs, for all ages, with unified focus
