[David Najib Kasir](#), a Milwaukee-based painter whose work is comprised of personal narratives and cultural history or events. In recent years, Kasir's work draws on stories from his Middle Eastern heritage. As an artist born here, Kasir reveals his cultural identity in paint and designs to inform viewers on the recent wars in Syria, in hopes of helping them develop an understanding of the millions of voiceless Arabs now living in chaos and disarray.

By using beautiful traditional Arab designs called Zellige to dress the figures in his work, Kasir shows the beauty of a culture and the tragedy as families try to hold on to it and each other as everything around them falls apart.

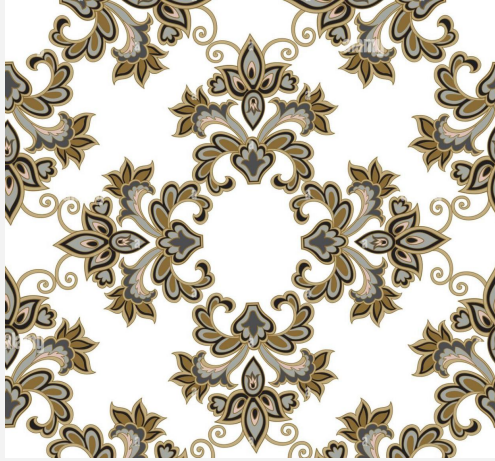

Representation in America is important. A midwest city like Waukesha should have an understanding of this and be a leader in showcasing people of all colors, ethnicities and cultural/religious backgrounds especially in it's downtown area. Refugees and Immigrants have been at the heart of my work for the past decade. Immigrants and Refugees are our friends and neighbors who are now and will always be a part of America's story as well as Wisconsin's. They are new Americans who should feel invited into a neighborhood of retailers & shops to help the local economy. In my proposal I seek to show representation of a culture of people who are often under or misrepresented. I'm an artist who is the son of a Syrian mother and Iraqi father. I understand what a public work of art can do for others in feeling seen outside their homes. I've created work in my studio for audiences to grow a better understanding of people who were once my neighbors or neighbors to my mother's country. I intend to encase figures in Arabic Zellij (mosaic tile work) patterns not as a backdrop to the figures, but as a means to give them a profile through which the patterns represent their culture. The cultural patterns that these figures hold on to, as they have integrated themselves into the new patterns of Wisconsin & midwestern American culture. My mural will depict a Wisconsin immigrant business owner and her family, to showcase how we help build economy, employment and community.

-Painting Proposal & Fabrication

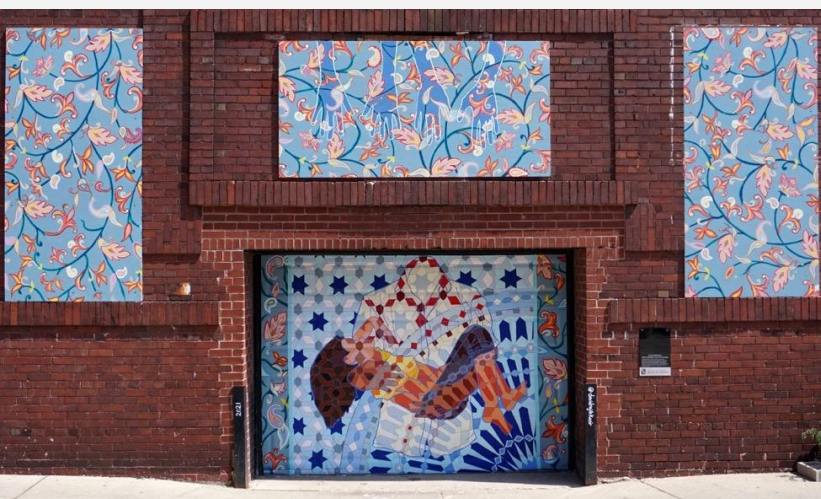
For mural area 1, I propose to create a painting portrait of a local Wisconsin immigrant Family that is also a business owner. I will create these paintings using a similar family portrait style with figures encased in an environment of Arabic Mosaic Designs as seen in my past work references shown on page 4 and in my sketches for these proposed compositions shown on page 5. I will paint on four 4x8' & 1 4x4' 3mm composite panels to be mounted on the building. The Arabic Floral Design Pattern References seen above will serve as inspiration for the Arabic Mosaic Designs the figures will be held in. The paintings will wrap around the edges of the panels as I've done in past works so they can be enjoyed from all angles. I am applying for Mural Area Two, fitting my square 12x12' proposal to your 14x13' wall space.

-Installation Method, Timeline & Maintenance

The paintings will be hung using a lift team that I assume the Friedman organization would handle. I will paint the 4 & half panels in my studio. The detail of my work will require at least 2 months (or more) of work for a total fabrication in composition & designs. I have a artist residency and gallery show in Vermont & NYC, planned in the month of April. I would prefer to start this project as soon as possible in February, so it could be completed by the end of May. Once work is completed, I will apply anti graffiti coat for protection & maintenance.

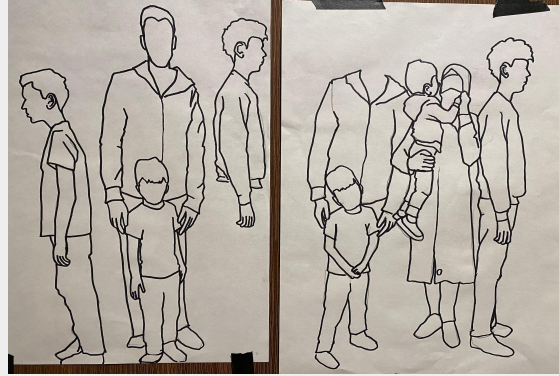

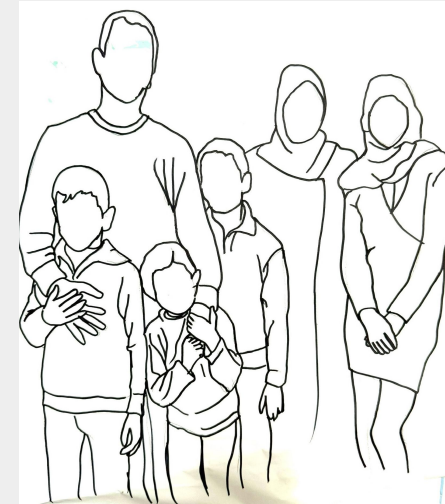

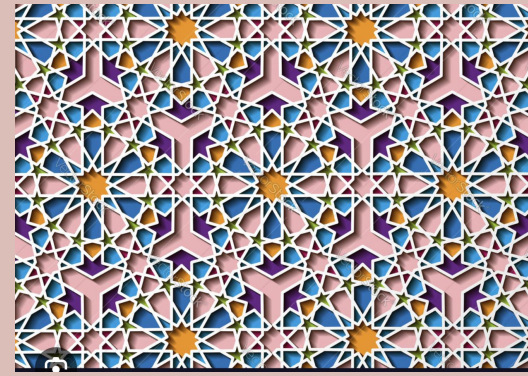
