

41st annual Waukesha JanBoree to be ‘Out of this World’

WAUKESHA — The City of Waukesha Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department announced the 41st annual Waukesha JanBoree, presented by Generac, will run from Friday through Sunday, Jan. 25. The 10-day winter festival features more than 40 free activities for adults and children. This year’s JanBoree theme is “Out of This World.”

The Waukesha JanBoree is sure to stellar this year,” said Recreation Supervisor Joanna Adamicki. “We’re bringing back the Laser Beam Light Show and the space theme will be woven into fun activities throughout the festival. You don’t have to travel to a galaxy far, far away to take part in all the fun!”

JanBoree launches with the Blast Off! event, sponsored by Citizens Bank, at Lowell Park, 2201 Michigan Ave., Waukesha. Activities include a Moon Walk, Asteroid Shots, Space Darts, a UFO Field, and more. Attendees can also view the dramatic ice and snow sculpture, “Ready for Launch,” sponsored by Educators Credit Union.

The sculpture features an impres-

sive space shuttle. The heated Black Hole Beer Garden will include a DJ, with products available from Raised Grain Brewing Co.

Don’t miss the “Out of This World” fireworks show, sponsored by Habush Habush & Rottier. Festivities continue at Lowell Park on Jan. 17, with the Black Hole Beer Garden, Rockin’ Universe Trivia and the Laser Beam Light Show, sponsored by Prolec-GE Waukesha.

The first weekend also includes geocaching, skating, and activities at Retzer Nature Center and the planetarium. Throughout the 10 days of JanBoree, participants can download the Goosechase Scavenger Hunt app to play along on their phones. Prizes will be awarded to the top three teams, and one lucky winner will receive a diamond necklace valued at more than \$4,000, courtesy of Costa’s Fine Jewelry.

Weekday events include Synchronized Skating, a Zumba Glow Party, a Milan 2026 Preview, Cookie Decorating, Family Painting, and more. Participants are encouraged to reg-

ister for the free Learn to Moonwalk class and join the Galaxy Glow Walk. The first week wraps up with Blast Off at the YMCA.

The second weekend is packed with events such as the Frosty 5K, an ice sculpting competition and Out of This World Family Fun. The Waukesha Public Library will help visitors prepare for “Your Mars Vacation,” while Minooka Park hosts Ice Fishing and the Alaskan Malamute Weight Pull.

Families can enjoy hands-on fun at Waukesha County Museum Making History. Learn how the sun drives severe weather at the CBS 58 Solar Force Weather Show with Chief Meteorologist Drew Burgoyne at the Schuetze Rec Center. Kids won’t want to miss the Penguin Egg Hunt, sponsored by the Waukesha Sunrise Rotary Club, where they can search the snow for candy-filled eggs left behind by Lil’ Chill. The festival concludes with a Candlelight Hike at Minooka Park and an Out of This World Concert and Instrument Petting Zoo.
