

# Hunt for Bigfoot with Bridges Library System

WAUKESHA — The Bridges Library System is inviting community members of all ages to take part in the Tracks in the Stacks Bigfoot Hunt, a free summer library adventure taking place at all 24 Bridges member libraries across Jefferson and Waukesha counties.

Running through Aug. 21, the systemwide event encourages participants to explore local libraries, search for friendly hidden Bigfoots, collect footprint stamps, and enter for chances to win prizes.

“Summer is the perfect time to discover all that your local libraries have to offer,” said Brittany Larson, director of the Bridges Library System. “The systemwide Bigfoot Hunt encourages community members of all ages to explore, connect, and make the most of their library visits now and throughout the year!”

To participate, visitors can pick up a Bigfoot Hunt map at any Bridges member library. Players may visit libraries in any order, locate each library’s hidden Bigfoot, collect footprint stamps, and discover something unique about every location along the way.

At each participating library, visitors can also submit a prize entry form. The more libraries participants visit, the more opportunities they have to enter and win.

At the conclusion of the hunt, the Bridges Library System will award twelve \$50 gift cards to randomly selected winners. Participants must complete the hunt and submit prize entries by Aug. 21. An active Bridges Library System CAFÉ library card is required to be eligible for prizes, although no library card is needed to participate in the hunt itself.
